Snow Science Investigators

How can you sculpt the snow? What techniques do you need to use?
Can you decorate your sculpture?

Snowflake Symmetry

- Can you find lines of symmetry?

Maths in the Snow

- Create some different size snowballs and estimate how heavy they are.
- Measure the temperature throughout the day - when is the coldest point?

Write your own poem about the snow.

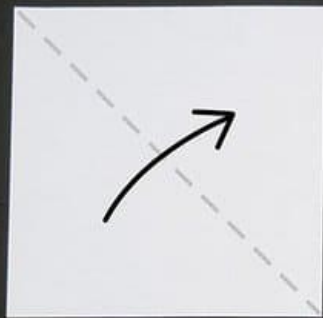
Think about:

- How it feels

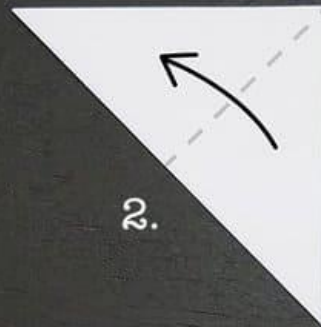
Reading
